CHEAPER £2 EVENING CAR PARKING INTRODUCED

DOES YOUR NOT FOR PROFIT CLUB OR GROUP NEED EXTRA CASH?



If you are running a community group or not for profit organisation in Marazion you can apply for extra money to help from either the Town Council or our Cornwall councillor.

The Town Council offers grants to local non-profit organisations that improve life for Marazion residents. A simple form, which can be found on their website, needs to be filled in and some bits of paperwork need to be provided before Marazion councillors will then consider the request.

Meanwhile, our Cornwall councillor has a Community Chest which allows them to give out money to local not for profit organisations that are helping Marazion look better or improve the town. They particularly welcome requests up to £500. There is some form filling but it isn't too bureaucratic. You can find both sets of documents by searching for Marazion Council Grants or Cornwall Community Chest.

MARAZION RESIDENTS CAN CLAIM FREE LOCALS' PASS FOR MOUNT

Want to access the Mount for free all year round?

Permanent residents of a household within Marazion just have to show proof of residency at the Change House on the Mount's harbour front, either with a driving licence, copy of a bank statement or an electoral roll polling card, when visiting the island.

A photo of the card holder will be taken to create a Locals' Pass card to be presented at future visits. Under 18s don't require a pass but must be accompanied by a Locals' Pass holder if visiting.

FREE WATER AND MONEY SAVING DEVICES BY COMPLETING A SURVEY

We have all heard the tales of woe with water companies of late. And we all know that with climate change the weather will be more unpredictable and the chances of a drought and standpipes are set to become more likely.

South West Water is set to add more reservoirs and possibly the controversial desalination plant at Par. In the meantime, local people can both do their bit to save water and save themselves money on their bills by getting some water saving devices for FREE.

SCHOOL INSTALLS TOWNS FIRST PUBLIC EV CHARGERS

The first two publicly available Electric Vehicle chargers in the town are up and running at Marazion School.

It means that for the first time locals and tourists can top up their electric vehicles from within the town. The Governing Board of Marazion School has also organised and managed some green energy projects recently.

The project will not only generate extra funds for the school, it will go a small way to help save the planet and all the while educate local children about the value of tackling climate change.

BORROW A FREE BLOOD PRESSURE MONITOR AT THE MOBILE LIBRARY

Marazion already has a fantastic range of books in the book boxes and charity shop, but if that's not enough, the Mobile Library also provides some and now loans out blood pressure monitors to help you keep an eye on your health.

Cornwall Council provides a once a month(ish) mobile library service that stops for 25 minutes on Godolphin Drive for people to pick up books or a blood pressure monitor, if preordered online, or browse what is in stock on the van.

ALL YOU NEED TO KNOW ABOUT JOINING MARAZION CHAMBER OF COMMERCE



Marazion Chamber of Commerce was formed in 1998 and includes over 60 small businesses. Their aim is to promote and develop a strong economic environment for businesses and the community.

Members benefit from an increased voice on town matters, listings on the Chamber website, and advertising

opportunities on town boards. The website, receiving around 90,000 visits per year, showcases local businesses and provides useful information for residents and tourists. Members can also post on Chamber social media sites.

Membership costs £50 per year for small businesses, with larger businesses paying more. Advertising on town boards costs an additional £80. The chamber makes donations to local community groups from membership fees.

The Chamber has supported projects like the Folly Field Children's Playground, Town Centre Public Toilets, and Cycle Parking Racks. They sponsored painting bus stops for the Queen's Platinum Jubilee and erected Union flags for the Coronation. Regular donations are made to the Greenwood Penny Christmas Tree committee and the Marazion Decorative Lights Committee. Recently, the chamber donated £2,500 for plants in the renovated Maypole Gardens.

GET READY FOR THE EXCITEMENT OF THE LOCAL ELECTIONS



It's that time again. Every four years we have the chance to either stand as a parish or Cornwall councillor, vote for them or vote If you're voting in person don't them out.

There are two sets of elections happening. One for Cornwall Councils' Longrock, Marazion and St Erth area representative. And one for Marazion Town Council.

Between 7am and 10pm, Thursday 1st May, you can pop to our Polling Station up at the Community Centre and vote for who you want.

The Cornwall Council elections will be contested by national political parties independent and candidates. Meanwhile, historically, the Town Council elections have never had political party candidates and instead feature independent local people passionate about Marazion.

by proxy (where someone can vote for you if you can't get to the polling station in person) but you register must and let the authorities know.

If you are not registered to vote and you want to exercise the right that millions fought and died for over the decades, then you need to

do so by Friday 11 April otherwise you won't be allowed.

forget the new rules which mean you must take photo ID, like a driving licence or passport, to prove you are you.

Alternatively you can vote by post. However, to do that you must also apply and be registered with the government by 5pm on Monday 14th April. If you miss this date, you can still vote in person but not by post.

If you want a proxy vote you must already be registered to vote - as does the person you want to vote on your behalf. But you have until 5pm on St George's Day (23rd April) to register for a proxy vote. All details can either be found on Gov.uk or on Cornwall Council's website.

You can vote in person, by post or If you are interested in earning a bit of cash on the 1st May then Cornwall Council is looking for people to work on both election day and the election count.

> They need a presiding officer (£295) and poll clerk (£221). This involves working from at least 7am until 10pm and also requires you to attend online or in-person training.

They also are looking for count supervisors and count assistants (£12.50p/h in the day and £17.50p/h if it is an overnight count).

Now the fun part - if you want to stand to become a councillor. You must have your nomination papers handed into Cornwall Council by no later than 4pm on Wednesday 2nd April.

For Marazion Town Council, there are 11 unpaid councillor posts available for the 1,170 voters in our town to vote to fill. In an ideal world many more than 11 people will put their names forward so that residents can vote for their preferred candidate.

However, should there be 11 or fewer people wanting to be a Marazion Town Councillor then there will be no election and no chance for you to select who you want.

If there are fewer than 11 councillors on Marazion Town Council then it can still operate but then the council will start looking to 'co-opt' (absolutely not press gang) people into serving our community.

The elections are held every four years and any elected councillor, unless they stand down, will serve for that amount of time.

NEW TRANSPORT FOR CORNWALL APP GIVES LIVE BUS DATA



Transport for Cornwall, the people who try and give us a regular and on time bus service through the town, have launched a new free app that will stop you having to wait for hours hoping that maybe one might turn up.

Download the app called **Transport** for **Cornwall** on your phone and, aside from seeing timetables, planning journeys, finding where your nearest bus stop is or seeing if there is any disruption on the route, you can also buy tickets.

Not only that, you can also see a live update every ten seconds of where the nearest and next bus is. Hopefully this then saves you spending lots of time huddling in the driving rain at a bus stop waiting for a bus that is late or never comes.

WORLD CLASS CONCERT AND ROLLING HARMONIES COME TO MARAZION

Two musical events come to Marazion's Community Centre this year. On the 19th April at 7.30pm the International Musicians' Seminar next generation of international classical musicians will take part in the Spring Masterclasses season.



Professors select a few to perform from each class, and this is a wonderful

opportunity to hear some vibrant young musicians on the brink of their international careers perform a wide repertoire of works. Under 25's go FREE, over 25's tickets cost £14-£18.

On the 7th June, try your hand at learning to be part of a rolling harmony a cappella group or enjoy their evening concert with the Kana Kernow singing workshop. Tickets for the workshop are £24, the concert is £12, combined are £32 with a limited number of bursaries for young people to join in.

WHERE ONLINE TO FIND OUT WHAT IS GOING ON IN MARAZION

BRAND NEW TRIATHLON WITH EVENTS FOR ALL COMERS COMES TO MARAZION



Sign up for The Kernowman on the 31st May, where 400 people will swim, bike and run Marazion's very own inaugural triathlon. The event will start and finish from the Folly Field from 8am on the Saturday morning.

There are four distances - for beginners a Super Sprint (400m swim - 10k bike - 2.5k run) all the way up to a Middle Distance (1900m swim - 90km bike - 21.1km run) for the more hardened triathlete.

The new event forms part of a seven event series of Cornish triathlons and is expected to bring in hundreds of supporters and so-called 'sherpas' into Marazion to boost trade and bring an exciting vibe to the town.

Weather permitting, the swim will be in front of the Mount while the ride will head inland towards Leedstown and back before the runners hit the tarmac to Penzance. The roads won't close so please be careful of runners and riders and cheer some hardy souls on.

SEAWEED FESTIVAL HITS OUR SHORES



Dive into a world of all things seaweed with fun and fascinating activities at the Cornish Seaweed Festival 20th and 21st September in Marazion. Although this is subject to date changes so keep an eye on their website.

Natural England, in partnership with the Cornwall Wildlife Trust, the Mounts Bay Marine Group and the Linnean Society of London, will host a two-day Cornish Seaweed Festival in our town.

There will be a sea-full of activities at five venues across Marazion: All Saints Hall, Town Hall, Quaker Meeting House, Marazion Church Hall, and the Folly Field.

The festival will offer something for everyone: outdoor adventures like rockpooling and foraging, hands-on science, captivating talks and workshops, seaweed art and products from local vendors, and a four-course seaweed meal. Most events are free but some will be limited in space.

MARAZION'S SHARE OF COUNCIL TAX TO RISE BY 4.04%

Marazion Town Council's part of your Council Tax bill will rise by 4.04% - or 41p per month on a Band D household.

Your bill is made up of three parts. The largest part is from Cornwall Council and helps pay for caring for the elderly, protecting vulnerable children, filling potholes, picking up the bins, and running leisure centres and libraries. The police get a much smaller slice to help tackle crime in Devon and Cornwall, while based on a Band D house, Marazion Town Council will ask you for £127.08 this year.

This gives the Town Council around £160,000 to spend on Marazion including improving, buying or repairing the play areas, toilets, speed radar signs, cemetery, bus shelters, benches, allotments, memorial garden, Maypole Gardens, Book Boxes and much more.

If you ever want to see what your hard earned money gets spent on in Marazion please do pop into the Town Hall and the Town Clerk or a councillor will happily go through that with you.

GORSEDH KERNOW TO HIT THE STREETS OF MARAZION



On Saturday the 6th September hundreds of blue robed bards will descend on Marazion to celebrate the history, culture, rituals and all things Cornish as they band together to create Gorsedh Kernow.

The Gorsedh will take place right across the town and will include the initiation of new bards, awards for organisations and people who have contributed to preserving Cornish culture, cultural performances including Cornish music, dance and poetry and symbolic rituals to reflect Cornish traditions. It will culminate in a colourful parade of the hundreds of bards to Folly Field who have come to our town to celebrate all things Celtic Cornish.

The first Gorsedh Kernow was held at Boscawen Un in County Penwith in 1928. To become a bard and dress in the blue robes you need to pass the first of four proficiency in the Cornish language exams or be selected 'for services to the Celtic spirit of Cornwall'. 
The £140,000 grant part-funded by the UK Government through the UK Shared Prosperity Fund, £20,000 set aside by the Town Council, £10,000 provided by St Aubyn's Estate and £2,500 from Marazion Chamber of Commerce was given so that the space became a hub for performances to wow crowds and bring Marazion people together.

MARAZION DEFIBRILLATORS NOW HAVE BLEED **KITS**

The seven defibs dotted around town now also contain 'bleed kits' - specialised trauma kits designed to provide bystanders with the products they need to stop life-threatening bleeding until paramedics arrive, potentially saving lives.

Marazion Town Council has worked with the school, health services, local businesses and Paul Williams from The Ronnie Richards Memorial Charity in order to deliver a plan for the town that meets the recommended defibrillator guidelines. We are the first town in the UK to meet national defib standards by having one machine within 400 metres of every resident.


All of the town's defibrillators are listed on 'The Circuit' - the National Defibrillator Network, which connects defibrillators to NHS ambulance services across the UK, so that in those crucial moments after a cardiac arrest, they can be accessed quickly to help save lives. RED RIVER DUNES SET FOR MAKEOVER

The dunes next to Red River are set to get a thorough overhaul and spruce up thanks to the Making Space for Sand project, Mounts Bay Marine Group, St Aubyn's Estate and Cornwall Wildlife Trust.

The last few years have seen the dunes eroded by storms and the sheer number of people walking and playing on them. They have also been taken over by some invasive species of plants.



Over the next few months, teams of fab volunteers will be removing species such as the Japanese Rose from the dunes and then replanting them with native Marram Grass. To help protect and regenerate the dune edges, low level rope fencing will be introduced to help reduce erosion from people standing or sitting on them.

NEW SPEED RADAR SIGNS COMING TOTOWN TO SLOW MOTORISTS DOWN



Following local residents complaining of speeding vehicles through town, new mobile speed radar signs are being fitted in Marazion.

The Town Council will be installing three speed radar signs to nudge people into being aware of how fast they are going and encourage them to slow down. While there is road furniture like humps and chicanes slowing people a bit, it is hoped an extra prod by the signs will also make people kill their speed and not a child.

Like the ones as you go through Rosesudgeon, These highly visible signs display real-time vehicle speeds, encouraging motorists to adhere to the speed limit and drive responsibly.

The signs can be shifted from one spot to another to help remind people of Marazion now being a 20mph zone. They will be popping up on Gwallon Lane, Turnpike Road and West End.
